OPENING DRIVE

Setting The Stage

Maryland celebrates Senior Day as the Terps welcomes the Indiana Hoosiers to College Park, Md. for the first time in history Saturday. The teams will square off at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium at Noon on the Big Ten Network. Maryland's 37-15 win against Indiana last season marked the program's first-ever Big Ten Conference win.

Junior defensive end **Yannick Ngakoue** needs just a half sack to tie Maryland's single-season sacks record (13.0), set by Mark Duda (1982) and Bruce Palmer (1978). He currently ranks second in the nation with 12.5 total sacks after posting 1.5 sacks at #14 Michigan State.

1

Maryland has played the toughest schedule in the country this season, facing teams with a combined record of 60-17 (78%). Five of the Terps' last six opponents are currently ranked in the *Associated Press* poll, with three of its last five currently in the top-10.

8

Junior utility man **William Likely** has done it all during his career at Maryland, including making a start on both sides of the ball against Wisconsin. He has eight career touchdowns (4 punt return, 2 kick return, 2 interception return), and nearly had his first career receiving touchdown at Michigan State before he was ruled down at the one-yard line after an official review.

200

The Terrapin defense has not allowed an opposing quarterback to throw for 200 yards in three straight games, all of which were against opponents currently in the AP top-25. Maryland has not allowed a 100-yard rusher since Ezekiel Elliott ran for 106 yards for #1 Ohio State on Oct. 10.

361

Maryland totaled a 2014 season-high 361 passing yards in its 37-15 victory at Indiana last season, including a pair of 100-yard receiving performances from Stefon Diggs and Deon Long. The Hoosiers are allowing an FCS-high 341 passing yards per game.

ON THE OFFENSE

On The Offense

TERPS ON THE RUN

- The Maryland rushing attack is averaging 169.3 yards per game - a mark that ranks sixth in the Big Ten Conference.
- Junior quarterback **Perry Hills** leads the team with 542 rushing yards and is averaging 77.4 yards per game over his seven starts this season, including three-straight 100-yard performances against Ohio State, Penn State and Iowa earlier in the year.
- Hills was the first Maryland player to rush for 100 yards in three straight games since Lance Ball in 2005.
- Senior **Brandon Ross** became just the 12th player in Maryland history to surpass the 2,000 yard milestone at No. 1 Ohio State on Oct. 10.
- Maryland has had a 100-yard rusher in five games this season.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

- The Terps have been the beneficiaries of a youth movement at offensive skill positions this season, as four different true freshmen have scored a touchdown: **Avery Edwards, Ty Johnson, D.J. Moore** and **Jahrvis Davenport**.
- It is the first time in Maryland history that four true freshmen have scored a touchdown in the same season.
- Moore is the first Maryland true freshman to catch three TD passes since Stefon Diggs in 2012.
- Davenport caught his first career pass against West Virginia and took it 46 yards to the end zone for the touchdown.

O-LINE CONSISTENCY

- Maryland features strong consistency on the offensive line, specifically tackle **Michael Dunn** and guards **Ryan Doyle** and **Andrew Zeller**. The trio has combined for 102 starts over their careers along the offensive line.
- Dunn, a former walk-on, leads the offense with 35 consecutive starts.

By The Numbers

1

Redshirt junior **Levern Jacobs** and sophomore **Taivon Jacobs** are the only receiving tandem in the country (FBS) that are brothers. The pair has combined for 607 receiving yards and five touchdowns this season.

2

Junior quarterback **Perry Hills** is currently the Terrapins' leading rusher with 542 yards (77.4 yards/g). He has recorded three 100-yard rushing performances this season, including a Maryland quarterback record 170-yard day at #1 Ohio State on Oct. 10.

3

True freshman wide receiver **D.J. Moore** caught a 40-yard touchdown pass from **Perry Hills** against Wisconsin for his third score of the season. Moore is the first true freshman Terrapin to catch three touchdowns in a season since Stefon Diggs totaled six in 2012.

4

Four different true freshmen have scored a touchdown for the Terrapins this season - a program record (**Avery Edwards, Jahrvis Davenport, D.J. Moore, Ty Johnson**). The four players have combined for six touchdowns, including two each from Edwards and Moore.

12

Redshirt junior wide receiver **Levern Jacobs** has caught a pass in 12 consecutive games that he has played in dating back to Nov. 23, 2013, against Boston College (he missed the 2014 season). He has also caught a pass in 19 of his last 20 games. He caught three passes for 55 yards at Michigan State, including a 37-yard catch that set up Maryland's lone score.

15

Senior running back **Brandon Ross** needs just 15 yards to pass Willie Joyner for 11th place on Maryland's all-time rushing list. The senior currently has 2,125 career rushing yards.

63

Junior wide receiver **Amba Etta-Tawo** led all Maryland pass catchers with five catches and a season-high 63 yards against #14 Michigan State. It was Etta-Tawo's largest yardage output since totaling 71 reception yards against Rutgers on Nov. 29, 2014.

85

Redshirt junior wide receiver **Levern Jacobs** caught three passes against Michigan State to surpass current NFL veteran Vernon Davis on Maryland's all-time reception list. Jacobs currently ranks tied for 18th in program history with 85 catches. He also ranks 24th all-time with 1,065 career receiving yards.

308.5

Maryland's offensive linemen weigh an average of 308.5 pounds. The number ranks first in the Big Ten East Division and second overall behind Wisconsin (310.1).

ON THE DEFENSE/SPECIAL TEAMS

Senior **Anthony Nixon** had one of the best games of his career at Michigan State, notching a career-high two interceptions, forcing a fumble and making seven tackles. Nixon currently has five career interceptions and leads the team with three in 2015.

8.3

Sophomore linebacker **Jermaine Carter, Jr.** leads the Maryland defensive unit with 83 tackles this season and ranks eighth in the Big Ten Conference with 8.3 tackles/g. He is also third on the team with 9.5 tackles for loss.

12

Junior **William Likely** totaled 75 all-purpose yards against #14 Michigan State en route to becoming the first primarily defensive player in Maryland history to eclipse 3,000 all-purpose yards. He is just the 12th player in Terrapin history to achieve the feat.

12.5

Junior defensive end **Yannick Ngakoue** totaled 1.5 sacks against Michigan State to bring his 2015 sack total to 12.5 - the third-most in Maryland single-season history. He needs just a half sack to tie the Maryland single-season record of 13.0 set by Mark Duda (1982) and Bruce Palmer (1978). His 12.5 sacks currently rank second in the nation.

15

Junior defensive tackle **Azubuike Ukandu** has broken out over his last three games, totaling 15 tackles and 3.5 TFLs during that span. Prior to this three-game span, Ukandu had posted just seven tackles and 2.5 TFLs over the course of eight career games.

25.5

Maryland is currently one of just two teams (Missouri) in the country with two players who have at least 6.5 sacks this season. **Yannick Ngakoue** (12.5) and **Quinton Jefferson** (6.5) have combined for 19.0 sacks, in addition to 25.5 tackles for loss. They are also the first tandem with at least 10.5 TFLs in a season at Maryland since 2004 (Shawne Merriman - 17, Chris Kelley - 13).

34

The Maryland defense has totaled 34.0 sacks as a team through 10 games this season, ranking sixth nationally and second in the Big Ten behind Penn State. The Terps are on pace for 41 sacks this season, which would be the third-most in school history behind the 1985 team (49) and 1981 team (46).

121

Maryland held Michigan State to just 121 passing yards last Saturday, the fewest for the Spartans since they threw for just 112 yards against Purdue on Oct. 19, 2013. Maryland has not allowed a team to pass for more than 200 yards in three straight games.

300

Senior cornerback **Sean Davis** notched his 300th career tackle in the game against Michigan State, becoming the first Terp to achieve the feat since Demetrius Harstfield in 2012. Davis also became the first Terp to reach 200 career solo tackles since D'Qwell Jackson (2005) against Wisconsin.

On The Defense/Special Teams

GETTING TO THE QB

- The Maryland defense has racked up 34.0 sacks through its first 10 games, ranking second in the conference and sixth nationally.
- Junior defensive end **Yannick Ngakoue** is ranked second nationally and in the Big Ten with 1.2 sacks/g, posting 12.5 so far on the season.
- Ngakoue currently ranks third in Maryland single-season sacks, and needs just a 0.5 sack to tie the single-season record originally set by Mark Duda (1982) and Bruce Palmer (1978).
- Ngakoue has had at least a half sack in nine consecutive games, including 1.5 sacks in last Saturday's game at Michigan State.

CARTER LEADS TACKLERS

- Sophomore linebacker **Jermaine Carter, Jr.** ranks eighth in the Big Ten Conference with 8.3 tackles/g. Carter has at least five tackles in 9-of-10 games this season, including a 14-tackle performance at West Virginia on Sept. 26.
- Carter also ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 5.3 solo stops per game, while **Sean Davis** is third in the category with 5.4/g.

EXPERIENCED SECONDARY

- Maryland's secondary has tremendous experience, featuring four players that have combined for 127 career starts: **Sean Davis, A.J. Hendy, William Likely** and **Anthony Nixon**.
- The grouping of Davis, Hendy, Nixon and Likely has started all 10 games this season.
- Sean Davis** recently accepted an invite to play in the 2015 Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Alabama on Jan. 30.
- Senior **Anthony Nixon** had one of the best games of his career at Michigan State, nabbing a pair of interceptions and forcing a fumble.

IT'S GOOD

- Reigning Lou Groza Award winner **Brad Craddock** has made 8-of-10 field goal attempts this season, including a season-long 44-yarder against Penn State.

A Likely Story

After standout freshman and sophomore seasons in College Park, many wondered what junior cornerback and return specialist **William Likely** would do for an encore as a junior in 2015. The short answer is everything, including making a start on both offense and defense against Wisconsin. He started the season with a bang, gobbling up a Big Ten record 233 punt return yards in the season-opener against Richmond before running back his second punt return for a touchdown in as many weeks against Bowling Green. In 2015, he has twice been named Big Ten Specialist of the Week (Week 1, Week 9) and Paul Hornung Honor Roll (Week 1, Week 3). Likely has the top-2 single-game kickoff return yardage marks in school history, including a 220-yard performance at #10 Iowa that included a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

MIKE LOCKSLEY

Interim Head Coach

Towson '92 • Fifth Year (10th overall) at Maryland

Mike Locksley returns for his 10th overall season at Maryland and assumed the interim head coaching duties on October 11, 2015. He is in his fifth season as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach and his 10th overall season at Maryland.

A native of Washington, D.C., Locksley returned home to rejoin the Terrapins after the 2011 season. He was an assistant coach at Maryland for six seasons (1997-2002).

During Maryland's debut campaign in the Big Ten in 2014, Locksley coordinated the highest scoring offense for the program in four seasons. The Terps averaged 28.5 points, which is the most since the team averaged 32.2 points per game in 2010.

Locksley's attack was orchestrated by quarterback C.J. Brown, who became Maryland's all-time leader in touchdowns responsible for with 58 after totaling 13 passing touchdowns and eight rushing touchdowns in 2014. Brown was one of only three players in the Big Ten to pass for over 2,000 yards and to rush for over 500.

Locksley successfully utilized the talent on the outside with wide receiver Stefon Diggs hauling in 62 passes for 792 yards and five touchdowns and earning second team All-Big Ten honors from the league's coaches and honorable mention honors from the media.

In 2013, Locksley guided an offense that eclipsed 5,000 yards (5,160) for only the fourth time in program history and the first time since 2003. The passing game excelled totaling 3,231 yards, the third-highest total in school history.

Under center, Locksley helped quarterback C.J. Brown become the first Maryland signal-caller to throw for over 2,000 yards (2,242) and rush for over 500 yards (576) in a single-season despite missing two of the team's top wide receivers in Stefon Diggs and Deon Long, who missed the final six games of the 2013 season due to injury.

Utilizing the depth at wide receiver, Locksley's unit had five players with 30 or more receptions led by Lavern Jacobs with 47 catches for 640 yards (13.6 ypc). The unit averaged 14.05 yards per catch, which tied for the 15th-highest average nationally.

In 2012, his first season back in College Park, Locksley coached five different quarterbacks, including three true freshmen and a converted linebacker after an unprecedented string of injuries hit the position.

Despite the constant shuffling at quarterback, Locksley found a way to get the ball in his playmakers' hands. Stefon Diggs led the team with 54 receptions for 848 yards (15.7 ypc), the most ever by a Maryland freshman. Diggs also caught six touchdowns and was named ACC Rookie of the Week three times.

A veteran coach with over 20 years of experience, Locksley previously spent four seasons (2005-08) as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach for the University of Illinois and two-plus years (2009-2011) as head coach at the University of New Mexico.

He possesses a well-rounded coaching resume, having tutored every offensive or defensive position except offensive line.

Locksley is also known for strong recruiting skills. He was listed as a top-25 recruiter in the nation three different times (2003, 2005, 2006) and was a finalist for 2007 recruiter of the year by Rivals.com. He also engineered top-10 recruiting classes during each of his two seasons (2003-04) as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Florida.

In Locksley's first stint as an offensive coordinator he took over an Illinois offense which was ranked No. 86 nationally in total offense (338.1 yards per game) and gradually improved it to a top-20 unit.

The Illini went from No. 72 nationally in total offense (354.6 ypg) in 2005 to No. 19 (438.3 ypg) in 2008. They led the Big Ten in rushing in 2006 (188.8 ypg) and 2007 (256.7 ypg), and in passing (269.3 ypg) in 2008. The rushing attack was twice ranked in the top-10 nationally (No. 10 in 2006; No. 5 in 2007).

Under Locksley's tutelage, quarterback Juice Williams passed for more than 6,000 yards and rushed for over 2,000 in his three years under Locksley and was a 2008 All-Big Ten choice. Williams set school records for rushing yards by a quarterback and single-season total offense. Williams led the Big Ten in passing (3,173 yards) and total offense (3,892 yards) in 2008 and was third in passing efficiency (136.15).

Wide receiver Arrelious Benn was a first team all-conference pick as a sophomore in 2008 after leading the league in receiving yards (1,055). He went on to become a second-round pick of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the 2010 NFL Draft.

The 2007 Illinois offense became just the third unit in school history to surpass the 5,000-yard mark and first to top 3,000 rushing yards. Led by Big Ten Offensive Player of the Year Rashard Mendenhall, the Illini led the league in rushing for the second straight year and finished fifth nationally at 256.7 yards a game.

Mendenhall, who averaged 129 rushing yards, was a first-round pick of the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2008 NFL Draft.

While at Illinois, Locksley helped develop running back Mikel Leshoure, who was taken in the second round (57th overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions. He also mentored offensive linemen Jon Asamoah and Jeff Allen, who were both drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs. Asamoah was selected in the third round (68th overall-2010) and Allen was taken in the second round (44th overall - 2012).

Illinois played USC in the 2008 Rose Bowl and finished the season ranked 18th in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll and 20th by the Associated Press following a 9-4 season.

In 2006, Locksley led an Illinois offense that paced the Big Ten and ranked 10th in the nation in rushing, averaging 188.8 yards. He tutored versatile running back Pierre Thomas, a two-time honorable mention all-league pick, who wrapped up his career as the No. 6 all-time rusher at Illinois and went on to star with the New Orleans Saints.

Locksley helped put the players in place to aid in Illinois' resurgence. He was named the No. 5 recruiter in the Big Ten and ranked among the top-20 in the nation by Sports Illustrated. In 2005, Rivals.com named him a top-25 recruiter.

Prior to his arrival at Illinois, Locksley worked two seasons for head coach Ron Zook at Florida, serving as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator and earning a pair of bowl appearances.

In 2004, Gators' running back Ciatrick Fason led the SEC and ranked 19th in the NCAA in rushing (105.6 yards a game) en route to second-team all-league honors. That season, Florida finished first in the SEC in both passing yards (271 per game) and total offense (426.9 ypg) and was second in scoring (31.8 points per game).

The year prior, three Gator rushers logged more than 500 rushing yards and each averaged at least 5.5 yards per carry.

Locksley had success both recruiting and grooming players in his first stint in College Park. He oversaw the running backs during his entire tenure, including the final five as recruiting coordinator.

Three different running backs - Chris Downs, Bruce Perry and LaMont Jordan - gained more than 1,000 yards and were named first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference.

Jordan spearheaded a 1999 rushing attack that led the ACC (234.1 ypg) and ranked 12th in the nation. Jordan was the runner-up for 1997 ACC Rookie of the Year and finished as a Doak Walker semifinalist. He was selected in the second round of the 2001 NFL Draft and totaled more than 3,700 yards for four teams in a nine-year professional career.

Perry was the 2001 ACC Offensive Player of the Year, a first for a Maryland running back, and the first sophomore to win the award. Both Perry and Jordan earned All-America honors under Locksley's watch.

Locksley played safety at Towson University, where he was the team's defensive MVP as a senior in 1991. He finished his career ranked 19th on the school's all-time tackles list and graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration and marketing.

GAME 1 RECAP: RICHMOND

LIKELY SHINES IN TERPS' SEASON-OPENING WIN

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - William Likely set a Big Ten record with 233 yards in punt returns and Brandon Ross ran for career-high 150 yards and one touchdown as Maryland rolled to a season-opening 50-21 victory over Richmond on Saturday.

Perry Hills threw two touchdown passes for the Terrapins, who scored 37 straight points after falling behind 14-13 in the second quarter.

Likely returned eight punts, including a 67-yarder for a touchdown that made it 43-14 with 10:30 remaining. He had another return of 47 yards.

The 5-foot-7 junior also had two kickoff returns for 63 yards, giving him 296 yards in kick returns for the afternoon.

Ross averaged 8.3 yards per carry and put Maryland up 29-14 with a 21-yard TD run early in the third quarter. He eclipsed his previous career high of 149 yards before the quarter ended.

Making his first start since 2012, Hills completed 12 of 21 passes for 138 yards and an interception. The junior wasn't exceptionally sharp, but he didn't have to be because the Terrapins totaled 341 yards on the ground.

Richmond's Kyle Lauletta went 18 for 30 for 220x yards. The Spiders mustered only 56 yards rushing, and Lauletta was sacked four times.

After Maryland took a quick 10-0 lead, Richmond went ahead 14-13 on a 4-yard run by Lauletta with 10:35 left in the second quarter.

Hills then directed a 12-play drive that produced a field goal by Brad Craddock, and a 37-yard touchdown catch by Malcolm Culmer made it 22-14 at halftime.

Ross scored the only touchdown of the third quarter, and a 1-yard touchdown run by Wes Brown made it 36-14.

Maryland then forced a punt, and Likely weaved his way through the Richmond defense before getting to the left sideline and diving into the end zone.

His 233-yard performance on punt returns broke the record set by Nile Kinnick of Iowa in 1939.

With the victory, Maryland improved to 5-0 in openers under coach Randy Edsall. The Terrapins have won six straight season openers and 11 of 12.

MARYLAND FALLS TO BOWLING GREEN

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Junior William Likely returned a punt for a touchdown for the second straight week, but Maryland fell to Bowling Green, 48-27, for its first loss of the season Saturday afternoon at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

Likely's 85-yard punt return is tied for the second longest punt return in school history, matching the 85-yarder by Tony Logan against Florida International in 2010. The school record for the longest punt return belongs to Dick Nolan, who returned a punt 90 yards against Clemson in 1953.

Senior Brad Craddock added a pair of first half field goals to give the Terps (1-1) a 13-6 lead over Bowling Green (1-1) at the half.

After a 55-minute weather delay pushed back the start of the third quarter, a 58-yard TD pass from Matt Johnson to Roger Lewis tied the game at 13-13 less than three minutes into the second half.

Maryland responded with a big play of its own to go back in front 20-13 when junior Perry Hills hooked up with D.J. Moore on a slant that the true freshman took 42 yards to the end zone.

The Terps looked to have stopped Bowling Green on its ensuing drive when Alvin Hill picked off a Johnson

pass in the end zone, but an offside penalty on the Terps gave the Falcons a first-and-goal opportunity that Travis Greene converted into a score on the very next play to tie things at 20-20.

Bowling Green outscored the Terps 28-7 in the fourth quarter to earn the victory in the team's first-ever meeting.

Johnson completed eight of 10 throws in the final frame, posting 134 yards and four touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

After the Falcons took their first lead of the game less than a minute into the fourth quarter, Maryland answered back with an 8-play, 75-yard scoring drive that was capped by a 22-yard TD pass from Hills to junior Levern Jacobs.

The Terrapins struggled down the stretch, turning the ball over on their final three drives.

Hills finished the game completing 15 of 30 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns, while also compiling 94 yards on the ground on eight rushes.

Junior Yannick Ngakoue posted a career-high three sacks, while senior Sean Davis finished the game with 14 tackles to pace the Maryland defense.

GAME 3 RECAP: USF

ROWE THROWS FOR 4TDs IN WIN OVER USF

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Caleb Rowe threw for 297 yards and four touchdowns in his first start since 2013, and Maryland notched a 35-17 victory over South Florida on Saturday.

Despite throwing three interceptions, the junior completed 21 of 33 passes and provided enough big plays to help the Terrapins (2-1) finish with 411 yards in offense.

Rowe threw touchdown passes of 12 and 22 yards to Avery Edwards; connected with Taivon Jacobs for a 70-yard score and hit Kenneth Goins Jr. for a 1-yard TD.

Maryland fumbled three times and totaled 12 penalties for 120 yards, but South Florida (1-2) also had its share of miscues -- including two turnovers, a dropped potential touchdown pass, a holding call that wiped out a touchdown run, and a personal foul penalty that erased a fourth-quarter first down when the score was 28-17.

USF quarterback Quinton Flowers went 10 for 19 for 60 yards with a touchdown pass and an interception. He was replaced for a series in the fourth quarter by Steve Bench, who was 0 for 3 with a pick.

The game turned late in the first half after South Florida used a 12-play drive to get a field goal and close to 14-10.

Starting at his own 34 with 52 seconds left, Rowe completed passed of 10 and 49 yards to Levern Jacobs. On first-and-goal at the USF 2, Rowe botched a pitch to Brandon Ross, who picked up the ball and took it into the end zone with 10 seconds remaining.

Maryland opened the second half with 45-yard kickoff return by Ty Johnson. Five plays later, Edwards made an excellent over-the-shoulder catch of a Rowe pass in the end zone for a 28-10 lead.

That proved to be enough to assure the Terrapins their second victory of the season.

Maryland's opening drive ended when USF's Devin Abraham returned an interception 42 yards, setting up a 4-yard touchdown pass from Flowers to Rodney Adams.

Rowe bounced back to direct a 59-yard drive, capped by a TD pass to Goins. Then, on the last play of the quarter, Rowe connected with Jacobs deep on the right sideline for a 70-yard score.

Last year, South Florida led Maryland in the fourth quarter before falling 24-17. In this one, the Terrapins took control much earlier and breezed through the final 15 minutes.

ROSS RUNS WELL IN LOSS TO WVU

MORGANTOWN, W. Va. - Senior Brandon Ross ran for 130 yards on 15 carries, but the Maryland football team fell, 45-6, to West Virginia Saturday afternoon.

The Terrapins (2-2) drove into West Virginia (2-0) territory multiple times, but were unable to capitalize. The Mountaineers jumped out to an early lead to clinch the victory.

Ross ran 55 yards to the West Virginia 1 late in the second quarter. Ross was ruled down before he fumbled out of the end zone, but the call was overturned and West Virginia took possession on the resulting touchback.

Caleb Rowe started the game, but was replaced late in the third quarter by Daxx Garman who got Maryland on the board with a 46-yard scoring toss to Jarvis Davenport.

Ross ran for 129 yards in the first half on 12 carries (10.8 yards/rush). It was the most rushing yards in the first half for a Maryland player since Josh Allen ran for 154 yards on Nov. 11, 2013.

TERPS DROP BIG TEN OPENER TO #22 MICHIGAN

COLLEGE PARK, Md. - Michigan scored three second-half touchdowns en route to a 28-0 victory over Maryland Saturday afternoon in front of a sell-out crowd of 51,802 at Capital One Field at Byrd Stadium.

The 22nd-ranked Wolverines won their fourth straight game to improve to 4-1 and 1-0 in Big Ten play. The Terps (2-3, 0-1) dropped consecutive regular season games for the first time since 2013.

Maryland's defense was stout throughout the opening 15 minutes of play, limiting the Wolverines to just 41 total yards, with just nine of those coming on the ground.

The Terrapins had a chance to take the lead following a fumble recovery by Sean Davis with 1:36 left in the first, but a Caleb Rowe interception stifled the scoring opportunity as a screen pass went through the hands of Brandon Ross.

Michigan led 6-0 at halftime before pulling away with two third quarter touchdowns. After Jake Rudock connected with Drake Johnson for a 31-yard score, wide receiver Jehu Chesson took an inside handoff and sprinted down the left sideline for a 66-yard touchdown to make it 21-0.

Ross finished with 44 yards on the ground for the Terps, leaving him just 13 yards shy of 2,000 career rushing yards. Jermaine Carter Jr. led Maryland with eight tackles, while Quinton Jefferson posted a sack, forced fumble and his first career interception.

GAME 6 RECAP: OHIO STATE

DESPITE STRONG START, TERPS FALL AT #1 OHIO STATE

COLUMBUS, Ohio - Perry Hills set a new program quarterback record with 170 rushing yards but the Maryland football team fell, 49-28, to No. 1 Ohio State on Saturday.

Hills rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another one, a 52-yard pass to D.J. Moore in the first quarter. The junior finished the afternoon with 133 passing yards.

The game swung in the Terrapins' favor when Ohio State missed a 44-yard field goal with 1:12 remaining in the first half. On the first play from scrimmage, Hills broke loose for a 75-yard scamper through the heart of the Buckeye defense. Hills then finished the drive with a 3-yard rush into the endzone to draw the Terps within a touchdown, 21-14, heading into halftime.

The Terps carried their momentum into the second half, capping off a 9-play, 69-yard drive with a 4-yard Hill touchdown rush to tie the game, 21-21.

The stardom of the Buckeyes (6-0, 2-0 Big Ten) and running back Ezekiel Elliott (2 TD's) proved too much for the Terrapins (2-4, 0-2) as they shook free in the second half and extended their nation's best winning streak to 19. Ohio State has won 26 straight regular-season conference games.

Ohio State coach Urban Meyer juggled his quarterbacks, using Jones to start drives and Barrett to finish them. Jones threw a 19-yard TD pass to Braxton Miller and connected on a 48-yarder to Jalin Marshall.

Trailing, 49-21, late in the game, Maryland used six plays and a 1-yard Wes Brown touchdown run to finish the scoring.

BALTIMORE, Md. - A 27-yard touchdown pass early in the fourth quarter by Christian Hackenberg lifted Penn State to a 31-30 victory over Maryland Saturday afternoon in front of 68,948 at M&T Bank Stadium.

Junior running back Wes Brown rushed for a seven-yard touchdown to give Maryland a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. It was his third touchdown of the season and 11th of his career.

Trailing 17-10, Hills found freshman wide receiver D.J. Moore for a 40-yard touchdown that sent the game into halftime all tied up. Moore has three touchdown grabs on the year, the most by a Maryland freshman since current NFL standout Stefon Diggs had six touchdowns in 2012.

Wisconsin finished off a seven-play, 71-yard drive with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Joel Stave to Dare Ogunbowale less than a minute into the fourth quarter. That score gave the Badgers a 31-17 lead over the Terrapins.

With Rowe in at quarterback, the Terps moved the ball late in the fourth quarter. The junior completed five passes for 81 yards on a drive that culminated with a 27-yard scoring strike to Levern Jacobs with 2:39 to go to make it a 31-24 game.

Maryland recover the ensuing onside kick, but an offside penalty on the Terps nullified the play. Wisconsin was able to cover up the next onside attempt and run out the remainder of the clock.

Maryland's 24 points against Wisconsin, the nation's leading defense (11.0 points per game), is the most points scored against the Badgers since their season-opening loss to Alabama (35-17).

DEFENSE STRONG IN TERPS' LOSS TO SPARTANS

EAST LANSING, Mich. - Despite a standout day from the defense that included forcing three turnovers, the Maryland football team fell to #14 Michigan State, 24-7, Saturday at Spartan Stadium.

Junior defensive end Yannick Ngakoue posted 1.5 sacks in the game to bring his season total to 12.5 (second in the nation), while William Likely finished with 75 all-purpose yards to become the first defensive player (12th overall) in Maryland history to reach 3,000 career all-purpose yards.

The Spartans broke the scoreless tie eight minutes into the first quarter when quarterback Tyler O'Connor capped off a 10-play drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass to Macgarrett Kings.

The Terps immediately responded with their own 10-play scoring drive, as running back Brandon Ross crossed the goal line from one yard out. The drive was largely set up by Perry Hills and Levern Jacobs, who connected for 50 yards on the series.

The Maryland defense stood tall for the next 20 minutes of action, but it was Riley Bullough's interception for a touchdown that broke the 7-7 draw with 2:07 to play in the first half. Michigan State then added a field goal from 35 yards out to close the half, giving the Spartans a 17-7 advantage.

The Spartans extended their advantage in the second half when they finished an 11-play drive with a Gerald Holmes 3-yard rushing touchdown.
